The undersigned swears there are reasonable grounds to believe that the above named defendant in Hillsborough County, Florida, did

The defendant, who was identified by his Florida driver's license attempted to get into his vehicle after exiting the City Side Lounge while intoxicated. The bartender and a patron attempted to prevent the defendant from entering his vehicle due to his extreme intoxication, and the bartender even called 911 to report that the defendant was attempting to get in his car and drive drunk. I drove by the parking lot, unaware that a call had been placed by the bartender, and observed the bartender and the patron struggling with the defendant as he was pulling away from them and trying to get into his vehicle. I pulled into the parking lot, initially believing that I was witnessing a physical disturbance. Upon learning from the bartender what had transpired, and upon seeing the defendant's obvious impairment, I too advised the defendant not to get into his car and to call an Uber or a friend. While on scene, an Uber driver pulled up and advised me of an impaired driver who was westbound on Henderson and was "all over the road". I had to leave the scene to attempt to catch the other impaired driver (who I was unable to locate). I returned to the scene and observed the patron and bartender struggling with the defendant as he attempted to get into his car once again. The patron blocked the driver's side door to prevent the defendant from getting into the car, but the defendant went around to the passenger door and got into the car, then slid over to the driver's seat. The patron was able to wrestle the keys from the defendant as I pulled back into the parking lot. I instructed the defendant to exit the car (he was still in the driver's seat) and he complied. The defendant was unsteady on his feet and had trouble balancing. His eyes were glassy, his speech was slurred and there was a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath. I asked the defendant if I could check his eyes and he consented, however, he would not follow my instructions as I attempted to administer the HGN and refused to perform additional SFST's. Based upon the above I arrested the defendant for DUI (actual physical control) and transported him to CBT where he was administered a breath test. The defendant's BrAC measured .094 / .095. Although over the legal limit, I did not feel that this BrAC accurately portrayed the defendant's level of intoxication. The defendant had stated to me that he takes prescription medication for PTSD (Zoloft and Bupropion) and I believe that the medication and alcohol had interacted together to cause a greater level of impairment than was reflected by the breath test. This occurred in Hillsborough County, Florida
