

D.U.I. PROBABLE CAUSE AFFIDAVIT

ON THE 25TH DAY OF March 2020 AT 11:02 A.M. P.M.

PERSONAL CONTACT/DRIVING PATTERN/OBSERVATION OF DRIVER:

On the above date and time I responded to 100 New Lake Drive in reference to a crash. Upon arrival I met with the driver later to be known as W/F Jennafer Harrison who stated she had just left the house to buy cigarettes and got into a crash. It should be noted Harrison was out of the vehicle while I was speaking with her, however a witness on scene later to be known as B/M Robinel Eugene witnessed the crash and observed Harrison behind the wheel of the vehicle.

Eugene stated he observed Harrison traveling North on New Lake Drive at which time Harrison lost control of the vehicle and struck a vehicle a 2006 Black Toyota Tacoma (NJ Tag Z69JZH) which was properly parked in the parking lot. The force of the impact caused the Toyota Tacoma to travel North which struck two other unoccupied vehicles a 2012 Black Hyundai (FL Tag LTVN44) and a 89 Ford Pickup (FL Tag Y00RHW) which were properly parked and to the left of the Toyota Tacoma; respectively.

It should be noted while speaking with Harrison she told me that she had a few drinks prior to leaving the house before the crash. It should also be noted while speaking with Harrison I smelled an odor coming from her body/facial/mouth area as Harrison spoke which based on my training and experience is known to be the odor of alcohol. Harrison also had glossy eyes, had trouble maintaining her balance, and her speech was somewhat slurred. Harrison was later identified via DAVID (FL DL H625-433-86-514-0) as Harrison did not have her Drivers License on her person.

Due to the aforementioned I felt Harrison's ability to operate a motor vehicle was impaired. I did tell Harrison that the traffic crash investigation (HSMV#89874183) was concluded and I was now starting a D.U.I. Investigation. Harrison was read her Miranda warnings at which time she told me that she had approximately (4) White Claw drinks approximately five minutes prior to her leaving her house. Harrison was asked if she had any physical injuries to her person which she stated no (BBFD refused). I did ask Harrison if she would submit to a series of Field Sobriety Tasks (SFST's) which she stated she would. See Below:

WALK AND TURN:

The task was demonstrated and explained to Harrison who stated she understood. Harrison was unable to keep her balance while listening to instructions, attempted to start too soon, could not stand in the original position.

stepped off the line numerous times, used her arms for balance, and was unable to do a correct turn. Harrison kept turning in circles while attempting to make the turn and forget how to complete the task.

ONE LEG STAND:

The task was demonstrated and explained to Harrison who stated she understood. Harrison swayed while balancing, used her arms for balance, and put her foot down without starting on the number she left off. Harrison started again on 1001 instead of 1008 where she left off when she put her foot down.

FINGER TO NOSE:

The task was demonstrated and explained to Harrison who stated she understood. Harrison touched her finger to the under side of her nose. Harrison also did not put her arms back to her sides, at which time I had to tell her she could put them down every time.

ROMBERG/ALPHABET:

The task was demonstrated and explained to Harrison who stated she understood. Harrison did rhyme the alphabet

Due to the aforementioned I did tell Harrison she was being placed under arrest for suspicion of Driving Under the Influence (D.U.I). Harrison was placed into handcuffs (D/L, checked for spacing) and placed into the back of my patrol vehicle #4863. I did take Harrison to the Palm Beach County Jail B.A.T. Facility at which time the twenty minute observation started at 0008 hours. During the twenty minute observation, Harrison did not burp, spit or regurgitate. Harrison was asked if she would submit to a lawful test of her breath for the purpose of determining its alcohol content which Harrison stated she would not. Due to this Harrison was read implied consent which she stated she still would not submit to a test of her breath. Harrison eventually complied and advised she would give a sample of her breath which resulted in .274 and .260 respectively. Harrison was later read her Miranda warning again on camera and did answer questions (please see Q&A for further).


