On 02/27/22 at approximately 1711 hours I, Officer David Morgan of Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, responded to a call of service request from USCG, PBSO and Palm Beach Police Department of a possible impaired vessel operator. See attached report from Palm Beach Police Department Lieutenant Paul Alber.

Upon contact with the vessel operator, later identified as Kevin Taylor Callis, VA DL# A62138317 DOB 06/03/1993, I noticed that his speech was slurred, eyes bloodshot with dilated pupils, cloths and property wet. When asked if he had fallen into the water to which he said he had not. I asked Callis if he had consumed any alcohol tonight to which he stated he had 4 beers within 6 hours. I asked Callis if he would perform seated field sobriety task (SFSTs) to he replied he would. I placed Callis into the general instructions positions and asked if he was stable. He said He was. I then told him to stay in that position and do not do anything else until I told him to do so.

I asked Callis if he would perform Seated Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks (SFSTs) to determine if he was impaired. Callis consented to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks (SFSTs).

I administrated the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN), Finger to Nose, Palm Pat and Hand Coordination tasks. During the HGN task Callis showed clues in both eyes. Lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at max deviation and onset of nystagmus prior to 45-degree. Callis also showed vertical nystagmus. Callis had 6 clues for the task. 4 or more clues indicate impairment.

The next task Callis performed was the Finger to Nose. I started by reading the instructions for the task. Callis was unable to follow instructions. He tilted his head back before being told to begin the task. When told to begin performing the task he had to be reminded to tilt his head back and close his eyes. I re-read the instructions so Callis could understand the task. He confirmed he did. When told to begin he used his right finger to touch his nose without instruction to do so. On the first left he used the wrong hand, and used the pad of his finger not fingertip. On the first right he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, on the second left he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. On third right he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. On the third left he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. On the task, moved his head. Callis had 10 clues for this task. 9 or more clues indicate impairment.

The third task I conducted was the Palm Pat. I explained the task instructions and demonstrated the exercise. Callis was unable to follow instructions of keeping his hands in position while I explained the task. I told Callis to begin. During the performance of the task Callis showed clues of a rolled pat, rotated hands by not keeping palms parallel and he stopped before told. In total Callis demonstrated 4 total clues on Palm Pat. 2 or more clues would indicate impairment.

The fourth task I conducted was the Hand Coordination. I explained the task instructions and demonstrated the exercise. Callis was not able to follow instructions of remaining with fist to his chest in the starting position while the task was explained and started at the wrong time. I told Callis to begin. On the 1st task (Forward Steps) Callis performed correctly. On the 2nd task (Hand Clapping) Callis did not perform the task. On the 3rd task

(Return steps) Callis perform the task correctly. On the 4th task (End position) he did correctly. In total Callis demonstrated 3 clues on Hand Coordination. 3 or more clues would indicate impairment.

At the conclusion of the SFSTs, Callis was arrested for operating a vessel under the influence at 2152.

I transported Callis to Palm Beach County Main Jail at 2217 hours in my patrol vehicle. At the jail, Callis provided two breath samples. The samples were 0.145/0.158 grams per 210 liters of breath at 2314 hours and 2319 hours respectively. Callis refused to answer questions, post-Miranda.

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On 2/26/22, at approximately 2200 hours. I was working a Special Assignment Overtime (SAO) detail on the Intracoastal Waterway, providing a security zone around a fireworks barge. At 2224 hours I heard a distress call on the VHF radio. The reporting party told the Coast Guard that someone had fallen overboard from another boat and the other boat was now turning in circles with no one onboard. When the caller provided their latitude and longitude, I recognized that they were in the Intracoastal Waterway approximately 2 miles south of the Lake Worth Inlet. Knowing that I was likely the closest first responder, I broke from my detail and headed to the scene.

When I arrived, the reporting party used a spotlight to attract my attention. They were on a sailboat just east marked channel, and east of Rybovich-Spencer Marina. When I pulled up alongside, they told me they had been in the cabin of their vessel when they heard a commotion outside. When they came out on deck, they found a man in the water and his boat running in circles nearby. They attempted to assist the man and, at the same time, called the Coast Guard. They told me the man was able to get his boat stopped, climb in, and maneuver away.

The reporting party described the subject as a white male in his late twenties to early thirties, with dark hair and a dark-colored T-shirt. The boat was described as a small rigid-hull inflatable "dinghy" with an outboard motor. They also said the man appeared to be "confused" or "disoriented" and was possibly under the influence of alcohol. The reporting party also handed me the subject's cell phone, which she said he handed her while he was in the water. She then pointed in a southeasterly direction, and told me that was where she had last seen the man.

I headed off, in a southeasterly direction, searching for the subject. When I did not find the vessel, I returned to the sailboat, obtained a better heading, and then continued my search. A short time later, I saw the silhouette of a small vessel, with a single person onboard, operating without navigation lights. I maneuvered close to the vessel and made contact with the operator, who matched the description given by the couple on the sailboat. When I pulled alongside, I asked the operator to put his motor in neutral. The subject replied that the boat was in neutral, but I could clearly see the propeller turning and pushing ahead. I therefore directed him to turn the motor off.

Once the engine was off, and the dinghy was secured to my patrol boat, I began speaking to the operator. He was identified by his Virginia Identification Card as Kevin Taylor Callis (WM DOB 6/3/93). Taylor was soaking wet, had dark hair, and was wearing a black T-shirt. Taylor admitted that he had fallen in the water, but denied having been in contact with the reporting party on the sailboat and denied having lost his phone. When I showed him his phone, Taylor accused me of stealing it, asking if I had taken it from his sailboat.

Taylor appeared to be disoriented, his eyes were glossy and red, and he had an odor of an unknown beverage when he spoke. He was traveling in a southerly direction when I stopped him, and he said he was headed back to his sailboat. However, when I asked Taylor where his sailboat was anchored, he pointed in an easterly direction. A few minutes later, when I asked him again, Taylor said his boat was anchored north of us, near Peanut Island. Given the totality of the circumstances, I suspected that Taylor's normal faculties were impaired and he was not able to safely operate his vessel. I contacted Florida Fish and Wildlife (FWC) and they dispatched officers to assist with the investigation. The Coast Guard and PBSO's Marine Unit were at the scene while we waited for FWC.

FWC Officer Morgan and FWC Investigator Brodbeck responses to Rybovich-Spencer Marina and they took over the BUI investigation. Officer Morgan administered field sobriety exercises to Taylor while I returned to the sailboat and obtained a written witness statement from the reporting party. After I received the statement and delivered it Officer Morgan, I departed the scene. Taylor was arrested and transported to the Palm Beach Course ail.

Re: Boater in the water distress call

On the night of February 26, 2022, I was working a special assignment detail for a fireworks display on the west side of the Everglades Club in Palm Beach Florida. At approximately 20:00 Hrs. a distress signal calling for the United States Coast Guard on channel 16 of the marine radio was heard. The caller stated that a person was in the water with their dingy circling around them.

The caller then stated the person had been able to swim to their sall boat and after a brief exchange he went back in the water toward the unmanned dingy, which was under power. Lieutenant Paul Alber was the captain of the Town of Palm Beach Police Boat. He decided to try to help the person in the water because the reports had escalated to unknown condition of the person in the water and our location was less than 2 miles from the caller.

We found the sailboat that had called for Coast Guard help and they said that the individual was on the back of their boat for a short time. The person handed them his cell phone and then returned into the water going back toward his dingy. Due to the darkness they lost sight of him but were able to see him again once he was back on his dingy.

They pointed a direction that the individual had gone so we continued to seek him out in the dark, since we did not know at this time if he was still in trouble or hurt. After searching the direction we thought he had gone for a while we returned to the sailboat to get some additional clarification from the couple on the boat. They then identified a better direction to search and we found the individual a short time later.

The man on his dingy appeared in our lights. He was lying almost on his back operating the dingy with a small gas outboard motor. Once he saw that we had him in our search light he repositioned himself and turned on his navigation lights.

We pulled up to him and began asking him questions and asked if he would put his motor in neutral. He replied he placed it in neutral, however the motor was still in drive. At that time Lieutenant Alber directed him to turn his motor off.

He was asked for identification and he replied that all he had was a DOD id card from Virginia. He produced that and gave it to Lieutenant Alber. Lieutenant Alber checked on his identification and found that he no longer had a license since it had been revoked for other offenses.

The U.S. Coast Guard arrived and pulled alongside of our vessel. Two members of the Coast Guard boarded our vessel to watch the individual while there was a discussion on how to handle the situation and condition of the boater. It was determined that his behavior and the open liquor bottle in the dingy

that we could not release him, on his own. The Coast Guard stated they did not have the ability to arrest him and charge him with a state crime. They contacted the Palm Beach County Sherriff who then contacted Florida Fish and Wildlife to deal with the suspected boating under the influence.

This all took a great deal of time to assemble the different agencies and to ascertain the next steps in the individual's night. While the boater was talking with other officers he changed his location of the main boat that he had departed from with his dingy. He initially stated it was in the area that we found him. He was heading south when he was located. This would have been in the exact opposite direction of where he was now stating his boat, was located, which is now claimed to be adjacent to Peanut Island.

We went back to the couple on the sailboat who provided a written statement which Lieutenant Alber took from them, to be included in his report, for the incident. After obtaining the written statement and securing a dock line, that was used to keep the dingy alongside the boat, we returned to the Town of Palm Beach Dock and stowed the police boat for the evening.

The fireworks event stayed in contact with me and they launched their pyrotechnics at 21:22 and concluded at 21:27 meeting our 21:30 deadline by a few minutes to spare.

Phase 2: Personal Contact with Operator

Upon contact with the vessel operator, later identified as Kevin Taylor Callis, VA DL# A62138317 DOB 06/03/1993, I noticed that his speech was slurred, eyes bloodshot with dilated pupils, cloths and property wet. When asked if he had fallen into the water to which he said he had not. I asked Callis if he had consumed any alcohol tonight to which he stated he had 4 beers within 6 hours. I asked Callis if he would perform seated field sobriety task (SFSTs) to which he replied that he would.

Phase 3: Pre-Arrest Screening

I placed Callis into the general instructions positions and asked if he was stable. He said he was. I then told him to stay in that position and do not do anything else until I told him to do so.

I administrated the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN), Finger to Nose, Palm Pat and Hand Coordination tasks. During the HGN task Callis showed clues in both eyes. Lack of smooth pursuit, distinct and sustained nystagmus at max deviation and onset of nystagmus prior to 45-degree. Callis also showed vertical nystagmus. Callis had 6 clues for the task. 4 or more clues indicate impairment.

The next task Callis performed was the Finger to Nose. I started by reading the instructions for the task. Callis was unable to follow instructions. He tilted his head back before being told to begin the task. When told to begin performing the task he had to be reminded to tilt his head back and close his eyes. I re-read the instructions so Callis could understand the task. He confirmed he did. When told to begin he used his right finger to touch his nose without instruction to do so. On the first left he used the wrong hand, and used the pad of his finger not fingertip. On the first right he used the pad of his finger not fingertip. On the second right he used the pad of his finger not finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. On third right he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. On the third left he used the pad of his finger not fingertip, and missed the tip of his nose. During the performance of the task, moved his head. Callis had 10 clues for this task. 9 or more clues indicate impairment.

The third task I conducted was the Palm Pat. I explained the task instructions and demonstrated the exercise. Callis was unable to follow instructions of keeping his hands in position while I explained the task. I told Callis to begin. During the performance of the task Callis showed clues of a rolled pat, rotated hands by not keeping palms parallel and he stopped before told. In total Callis demonstrated 4 total clues on Palm Pat. 2 or more clues would indicate impairment.

The fourth task I conducted was the Hand Coordination. I explained the task instructions and demonstrated the exercise. Callis was not able to follow instructions of remaining with fist to his chest in

the starting position while the task was explained and started at the wrong time. I told Callis to begin. On the 1st task (Forward Steps) Callis performed correctly. On the 2nd task (Hand Clapping) Callis did not perform the task. On the 3rd task (Return steps) Callis perform the task correctly. On the 4th task (End position) he did correctly. In total Callis demonstrated 3 clues on Hand Coordination. 3 or more clues would indicate impairment.

Arrest of Operator

At the conclusion of the SFSTs, Callis was arrested for operating a vessel under the influence at 2152 hours.

I transported Callis to Palm Beach County Main Jail at 2217 hours in my patrol vehicle. At the jail, Callis provided two breath samples. The samples were 0.145/0.158 grams per 210 liters of breath at 2314 hours and 2319 hours respectively. Callis refused to answer questions, post-Miranda.

Callis was issued the following citation:

Citation 1: V684221

327.35(1)(c): Operating a vessel with an unlawful breath alcohol level of .08 or higher

Disposition of Vessel

The vessel was given to Palm Beach Sheriffs Office (PBSO) by Callis to return to the vessel in is staying on within the mooring field. PBSO, after searching for an hour, could not locate the vessel to secure the dingy to. In lieu of securing the dingy to the main vessel, PBSO had the dingy towed.

All above events were captured on agency issued body worn camera and uploaded to the agency server.
