Narrative:

On August 31, 2022, at 3:57 PM, I was dispatched by the Lake Worth Regional Communications Center (LWRCC) to a possible vehicle accident. LWRCC advised a passing motorist observed a dark colored vehicle on the inside shoulder and weren't sure if the vehicle was left abandoned. The location given by the passing motorist was northbound Interstate 95 (State Road 9) and 45th Street.

I arrived on scene, northbound SR 9 just south of 45th St, on the inside shoulder. I observed a black in color Mazda 3 with its front left corner against the concrete barrier wall and a Florida tag of PKCG78. As I was walking up to the car, I noticed the engine was running. I quickly began to assess if someone was inside and attempted to open the doors but they were locked. Due to the dark window tints, I could not see inside the car, so I made a driver's side approach and using my hands peered through the driver's side window.

That's when I noticed a white male sitting in the driver seat, "slouched" or slumped over with its head facing down. He was drooling and his eye lids were open, but his eyeballs were rolled towards the back to the point where I could only observe the white area of his eyes. At this point, I determined the subject was overdosing and needed urgent medical attention since he was unresponsive. I then began to bang on the roof and driver's side window in an attempt to "wake" the driver up.

After multiple unsuccessful attempts, I requested more units for assistance and for medical emergency services. I also advised dispatch that I was going to "break" the window to gain access to the driver and administer NARCAN (N

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aloxone HCl nasal spray). I then used my state issued "window puncher" on the lower right corner of the driver's side window and shattered the window. Using my state issued "ASP" or baton, I scraped along the edges and removed the window. At this point, Trooper Depeine #4782 arrived on scene.

I then unlocked all doors and began yelling at the driver who was still unresponsive. I then reclined the driver seat and open my sealed NARCAN kit (S/N 18644074727202 Exp May 2024) and administered the first dose through the left nostril. The driver was still unresponsive and after 1 minute, I administered the second dose through the right nostril. After two doses, the driver was still unresponsive. At this time, Trooper Villarín # 4902 arrived on scene.

Since the driver was still unresponsive, Sgt. Alarcon advised over the radio to administer a third dose of NARCAN. Trooper Villarín then provided me a third dose from her NARCAN kit (S/N 55418680641874 Exp May 2024). I then administered the third dose through the left nostril and the driver began to regain consciousness. The driver sat up and appeared disoriented. I began to assure the driver that everything was ok and to take deep breaths.

Once the driver came to his senses, I asked him what he took, and he stated "oxycodone". I asked if he took anything else or too much and he stated, "only what's prescribed to me". At this time, West Palm Beach Fire Rescue arrived on-scene and began to treat the driver. He was then identified as Bruce Lee Parent, via his Florida driver's license (P-653-072-79-406-0) and DAVID. Mr. Parent was also the registered owner of the vehicle.

Mr. Parent was then transported to JFK north for further evaluation. I then

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requested a wrecker off rotation and determined Mr. Parent had collided with the concrete wall. The vehicle had damage to its front left rim and front left bumper. The concrete wall also suffered damage due to the collision. While conducting a vehicle inventory, I observed a small clear baggie with a clear capsule and a white powdery substance on the front passenger seat. Based on my training and experience and the way the contraband was packaged, I believed it to be a chemical or controlled substance and within reach of Mr. Parent.

Once at JFK North, I made contact with Mr. Parent and Dr. Steckel. Dr. Steckel advised Mr. Parent was going to be admitted for further evaluation for at least one day. I then asked Mr. Parent to explained what occurred and he stated, "I don't remember". Mr. Parent went on to advise he did not have any relocation of the incident. I then concluded my crash investigation at 6:58 PM and advised Mr. Parent I was now conducting a DUI investigation and read him his Miranda rights. Mr. Parent advised he understood and agreed to talk.

I then asked Mr. Parent if he took any medication or illegal drugs and he stated "no, only oxycodone". He advised he is prescribed "5 a day". I then asked him about the contraband located in the front passenger seat and he stated he did not have any knowledge of it.

Based on my initial observations and the totality of circumstances and the fact that Mr. Parent was being admitted into the hospital for at least a day, I asked if he was willing to provide a voluntary blood sample. Mr. Parent refused. I then read him Florida Implied Consent and he refused again at 7:05 PM and requested to speak to his attorney.

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I then transported the contraband to the FHP Lantana Station for evidence submission. Once at the station and upon further inspection, I observed there to be two pill capsules, one intact with a white powdery substance and one open with the white powdery substance inside the baggie. The total weight of the contraband was .7 grams. The contraband was then packaged and submitted into evidence.

Due to Mr. Parent being admitted into the hospital, a Warrant will filed for his arrest into the State Attorney's Office.

All events occurred in Palm Beach County.
