PERSONAL CONTACT/DRIVING PATTERN/OBSERVATION OF DRIVER:

On the above date and time I responded to 850 W. Gateway Blvd (Mobil Gas Station), upon the request of Officer B. Jones (#954), who was on scene due to a suspicious person. Let it be noted that this incident occurred within the City of Boynton Beach, Palm Beach County, Florida.

Upon arrival I made contact with Officer Jones who advised that she was flagged down by B/M Ellington, Tyler (07/07/95) and W/F Nassar, Ghena (04/15/93), while at the above address, in reference to a possible impair driver. Ellington quickly advised Officer Jones that there was an unknown W/F (later identified as Piskulic, Dana 10/21/79) driving a White Ford Focus bearing Florida tag DQVT01 possibly impaired and that there was an approximately 7yo female in the back seat. Ellington pointed out the vehicle and Piskulic, who was parked in the middle of the parking lot of the Mobil Gas Station, to Officer Jones. Ellington advised Officer Jones that he observed Piskulic operating the motor vehicle from the parking lot of 1005 W. Gateway Blvd (Publix) to Mobil. Officer Jones advised based on the information given by Ellington, she made contact with Piskulic in reference to conducting a welfare check. Officer Jones advised that while speaking with Piskulic, she noticed that he eyes were bloodshot/glassy and her speech was thick and slurred. Officer Jones advised that she detected an odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage emitting from Piskulic's breath, which intensified as she spoke. Officer Jones advised on plain view she observed two large silver Coors Light cans in the center console, with one being opened. Officer Jones advised that in the back seat she observed a young W/F, later identified [REDACTED] (01/27/09). Officer Jones advised that [REDACTED] appeared to had been crying and frighten. Officer Jones advised that based in her observations she contacted me in reference to conducting a DUI investigation. See Officer Jones supplement for further.

I then made contact with Ellington and Nassar. Ellington advised that while they exited Publix (1005 W. Gateway Blvd) they noticed Piskulic exiting the above vehicle and "wobble" into Publix alone. Ellington advised that Piskulic had parked her vehicle directly in front of the main entrance to Publix, in the middle of the thoroughfare. Ellington advised that Piskulic appeared to be under the influence of something. Ellington advised that as they passed Piskulic's vehicle they noticed that both of her right tires were flat. Ellington admitted to thinking that the incident was unusual but entertaining at the same

time, therefore he began to record the incident via his cell phone towards the direction of Piskulic's vehicle; waiting for Piskulic to exit the store. Ellington advised that while recording he noticed that someone was in the vehicle alone and that it was a child [REDACTED]. Ellington advised moments later (approximately 3 minutes from when he first observed Piskulic) Piskulic exited Publix and began to ask people for assistance with her tires. Ellington advised at that moment he and Nassar began to walk back to their vehicle. Upon approaching their vehicle, Piskulic had driven her vehicle to them. Ellington advised that Piskulic began to argue with them due to the fact that they were recording her. Ellington advised that argument was brief and after momentarily losing her keys, Piskulic restarted her vehicle and drove away. Ellington advised that believing that Piskulic was impaired and observing her driving with a child in the back seat they began to follow Piskulic and called 911. Ellington advised that Piskulic had entered the outside lanes of W. Gateway Blvd and proceeded westbound. Ellington advised that prior to approaching the traffic light for the entrance of 1005 W. Gateway Blvd, Piskulic crossed over the 3 westbound lanes of W. Gateway Blvd and entered the left (south) turn lane. Ellington advised that Piskulic ran the solid red traffic control device at the intersection and entered the plaza of 960 W. Gateway Blvd. Ellington advised that Piskulic circled the parking lot then reentered W. Gateway Blvd and began to travel eastbound. Ellington advised that Piskulic then entered the parking lot of 850 W. Gateway Blvd (Mobil) and parked her vehicle in the middle on the parking lot. Let it be noted that Piskulic had traveled that entire distance with 2 flat tires. Ellington advised that while he and Nassar were entered the parking lot of Mobil they observed Officer Jones and informed her of the incident. Ellington and Nassar advised that while speaking with Piskulic, Piskulic appeared to be intoxicated. Ellington and Nassar completed and signed a sworn statement.

I then made contact with Piskulic, who was sitting inside her vehicle; which I also observed [REDACTED] in the back seat of the vehicle. Piskulic vehicle was off and Piskulic was holding on to her keys. I identified myself to Piskulic and asked her if she was okay, which she stated yes. I asked Piskulic what was the reason for all the officers to be here and speaking with her, which she advised that she did not know. Piskulic further advised that she had two flat tires from hitting a curb and was trying to put air in them. While speaking with Piskulic, I detected an odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage emitting from Piskulic's breath, which intensified as she spoke. In plain view I observed two large 24oz can of Coors Light in the center cupholders of the vehicle. The cans appeared to be cold, as they were covered in condensation. One on the cans was opened as well. Based on my investigation at this point, I requested Piskulic to walk to the front of my patrol vehicle (4445) so that I could continue my investigation, when she argued to. While walking to front of my patrol vehicle Piskulic was swaying side to side. Once in front of my patrol I advised Piskulic that the investigation was being audio and video recorded, which he stated that she understood. I then began to inquire more the accident. Piskulic advised that while making a right turn into the east entrance to the parking lot of Publix, from W. Gateway Blvd, she struck the concrete curb. Piskulic advised that as a result both of her 2

right tires were flat and had a gash. Piskulic advised that she has triple-A (AAA) and Geico and was going to contact them in reference to getting her tires fixed. Piskulic advised that she drove to Mobil so that she could fill up her tires with air prior to calling for a tow truck. While speaking with Piskulic, she was very hostile towards me and very uncooperative in the investigation. Piskulic did not follow simple directions and was very argumentative. At that point I advised Piskulic that I had concluded my Accident Investigation and that I was began a DUI Investigation, which she stated that she understood. I then read Piskulic her Miranda Warnings. When I asked Piskulic if she understood, she advised that she refused. I was asked her what was she refusing, which she stated that she knew what I was doing and she was not going to do anything. The odor of an alcoholic beverage was still emitting from Piskulic breath and still intensified as she spoke. I asked Piskulic how much did she have to drink tonight which she stated a beer. When I asked her if that included the open container in her vehicle, she stated yes. Piskulic continued to be uncooperative and hostile during the investigation. I then asked Piskulic if she was willing to submit to serial of standardized field sobriety task, which he advised no. I then advised Piskulic that by refusing to submit to the standardized field sobriety task that it can and will be used against her in a court of law, which she stated that she understood. I then requested a second time, which Piskulic advised no again.

I then spoke with Piskulic [REDACTED] W/M [REDACTED] (02/01/58), who was on scene during the investigation. [REDACTED] advised that Piskulic was supposed to pick him up from work (Commerce Rd and High Ridge Rd) at 2200hrs. [REDACTED] advised that he was contacted by Piskulic to let him know that she as Mobil. [REDACTED] advised that he does not know why Piskulic was in the Publix parking lot. [REDACTED] and the vehicle were left in the custody of

██████████ I then transported Piskulic to the Boynton Beach Police Department. I arrived at the Boynton Beach Police Department at 2248, started my 20 minutes observation at 2250hrs and completed at 2310hrs. Upon completion I requested Piskulic to provide a sample of his breath to determine the alcohol content, which she refused. I read Piskulic Implied Consent; which she stated that she understood. I then requested Piskulic a second time for a sample of her breath to determine the alcohol content, which she refused again. I asked Piskulic if she recalled me reading her Miranda Warning to her, which she stated yes and that she did not need me to recite them. I asked Piskulic if she was willing to answer the questions on this packet, which she refused.

Based on the above stated facts I have established Probable Cause to charge Piskulic with 1M count of DUI pursuant with F.S.S. 316.193.1. Due to the fact that Piskulic had left ██████████ unattended in the vehicle while she entered Publix and was found to be driving a motor vehicle while under the influence, Piskulic was also charged with Child Neglect w/o Harm pursuant with F.S.S. 827.03. ~~352D~~

While removing Piskulic's personal belongings from her persons, post arrest, she asked if I was going to give her a chance to "blow into a machine". I advised Piskulic that she had her opportunity and that she refused. Piskulic became upset and argumentative, advising that I did not give her a chance to "blow" and that I tricked her. Moments later Piskulic was placed into a holding cell. While in the holding cell Piskulic proceeded to bang on the cell door and demanded "toilet paper, a blanket and a pillow". Myself and Officer Strong advised Piskulic that if she needed toilettree it would be provided, but a pillow and blanket will not be. Piskulic continued to be hostile towards officer, yelling profanities, and continued to bang on the cell door with her hands. I advised Piskulic that she needed to seat down and stop banging on the cell doors before she hurt her-self doing so. Piskulic laugh and stated "what are you going to do" and continued to bang on the cell door. I advised Piskulic that she needed to stop before she hurts her hands, but she refused. I then advised Piskulic that if she continued to bang on the door with her hands, for her safety, I would have to place her in a restraint chair. Piskulic laughed and continued. At that moment I opened the cell door, with Officer Strong standing by me, and once opened Piskulic approached me in an aggressive manner; making chest to chest contact. At that moment I placed my hand on Piskulic left front shoulder, near her neck, and began to walk Piskulic backwards towards the metal bench in the holding cell. As we approached the bench Piskulic lost her balance and fell backwards onto the ground. Piskulic's mid to lower back struck the bench, at which time she became irate and continued to be hostile. Piskulic did not appear to be injured at the time, as she stood and sat with no problems. Piskulic was then placed into the restraint chair for her safety. The incident was advised to Sgt. De Los Rios immediately afterwards. As a precaution Piskulic was transported to Bethesda Hospital East due to the fact that she received redness to her mid back due to striking the metal bench.



While speaking with Piskulic, she was very hostile towards me and very uncooperative in the investigation. Piskulic did not follow simple directions and was very argumentative. At that point I advised Piskulic that I had concluded my Accident Investigation and that I was began a DUI Investigation, which she stated that she understood. I then read Piskulic her Miranda Warnings. When I asked Piskulic if she understood, she advised that she refused. I was asked her what was she refusing, which she stated that she knew what I was doing and she was not going to do anything. The odor of an alcoholic beverage was still emitting from Piskulic breath and still intensified as she spoke. I asked Piskulic how much did she have to drink tonight which she stated a beer. When I asked her if that included the open container in her vehicle, she stated yes. Piskulic continued to be uncooperative and hostile during the investigation. I then asked Piskulic if she was willing to submit to serial of standardized field sobriety task, which he advised no. I then advised Piskulic that by refusing to submit to the standardized field sobriety task that it can and will be used against her in a court of law, which she stated that she understood. I then requested a second time, which Piskulic advised no again.

At that time, Piskulic was placed into custody under suspicion of DUI. Piskulic was placed into handcuff (D/ L and Spaced) and placed in the back seat of my patrol vehicle (#4445). I then spoke with Piskulic [REDACTED], W/M [REDACTED] (02/01/58), who was on scene during the investigation. [REDACTED] advised that Piskulic was supposed to pick him up from work (Commerce Rd and High Ridge Rd) at 2200hrs. [REDACTED] advised that he was contacted by Piskulic to let him know that she as Mobil. [REDACTED] advised that he does not know why Piskulic was in the Publix parking lot. [REDACTED] and the vehicle were left in the custody of [REDACTED] I then transported Piskulic to the Boynton Beach Police Department. I arrived at the Boynton Beach Police Department at 2248, started my 20 minutes observation at 2250hrs and completed at 2310hrs. Upon completion I requested Piskulic to provide a sample of his breath to determine the alcohol content, which she refused. I read Piskulic Implied Consent; which she stated that she understood. I then requested Piskulic a second time for a sample of her breath to determine the alcohol content, which she refused again. I asked Piskulic if she recalled me reading her Miranda Warning to her, which she stated yes and that she did not need me to recite them. I asked Piskulic if she was willing to answer the questions on this packet, which she refused.

Based on the above stated facts I have established Probable Cause to charge Piskulic with 1M count of DUI pursuant with F.S.S. 316.193.1. Due to the fact that Piskulic had left [REDACTED] unattended in the vehicle while she entered Publix and was found to be driving a motor vehicle while under the influence, Piskulic was also charged with Child Neglect w/o Harm pursuant with F.S.S. 827.03. ~~3620~~

While removing Piskulic's personal belongings from her persons, post arrest, she asked if I was going to give her a chance to "blow into a machine". I advised Piskulic that she had her opportunity and that she refused. Piskulic became upset and argumentative, advising that I did not give her a chance to "blow" and that I tricked her. Moments later Piskulic was placed into a holding cell. While in the holding cell Piskulic proceeded to bang on the cell door and demanded "toilet paper, a blanket and a pillow". Myself and Officer Strong advised Piskulic that if she needed toilettree it would be provided, but a pillow and blanket will not be. Piskulic continued to be hostile towards officer, yelling profanities, and continued to bang on the cell door with her hands. I advised Piskulic that she needed to seat down and stop banging on the cell doors before she hurt her-self doing so. Piskulic laugh and stated "what are you going to do" and continued to bang on the cell door. I advised Piskulic that she needed to stop before she hurts her hands, but she refused. I then advised Piskulic that if she continued to bang on the door with her hands, for her safety, I

would have to place her in a restraint chair. Piskulic laughed and continued. At that moment I opened the cell door, with Officer Strong standing by me, and once opened Piskulic approached me in an aggressive manner; making chest to chest contact. At that moment I placed my hand on Piskulic left front shoulder, near her neck, and began to walk Piskulic backwards towards the metal bench in the holding cell. As we approached the bench Piskulic lost her balance and fell backwards onto the ground. Piskulic's mid to lower back struck the bench, at which time she became irate and continued to be hostile. Piskulic did not appear to be injured at the time, as she stood and sat with no problems. Piskulic was then placed into the restraint chair for her safety. The incident was advised to Sgt. De Los Rios immediately afterwards. As a precaution Piskulic was transported to Bethesda Hospital East due to the fact that she received redness to her mid back due to striking the metal bench.

Due to Piskulic's actions, she was additional charged with Assault on a Leo pursuant with F.S.S. 784.07.2A. Photos were taking of Piskulic's injuries.

SFST video 4445 and BAT Video was later placed into BBPD Evidence, to include photos taken of Piskulic's vehicle and the beer cans. Let it be noted the opened beer can was approximately 3/4 full, cold to the touch.

DCF was contacted and informed of the incident.
